B. God is justified in His words.

Is God unjust to inflict wrath?

C. God's word on God as Judge,

Shall not the Judge of all the earth do right?

God shall bring every work into judgment.

Who shall stand when he appeareth?

The Lord shall judge his people.

The great day of his wrath is come;

and who shall be able to stand?

Jer. 23:6, The Lord Our Righteousness

Dan. 9:7, O Lord, righteousness belongeth unto thee.

Ps. 25:8, Good and upright is the Lord

His word through Isaiah and Micah

C. Contrast to wickedness of men.

Malachi, Sun of Righteousness

D. Manifested

1. Apart from the law, not legal

2. Divine - not creature but Creator

3. Not of our doing or obedience

4. Witnessed to by law and prophets

5. By your believing and faith

6. Greater than that of Adam

E. How can we have this Righteousness?

1. Must be real and genuine

2. Gift of God, Grace

3. Not the sinner's own

4. Through faith, not works

5. Law demands perfect obedience

6. "unto all" - as the brazen serpent, cities of refuge

7. All have sinned - no difference - all need this

righteousness. We must first lay aside all of our self-right, every self-excusing plea, and take the place of the guilty sinner before God.

Where is one who has never failed?

"God be merciful to me a sinner."
