I. Should Have a Good Launching

1. Not a runaway or secret marriage.

A. "In the presence of these witnesses"

B. When William Jennings Bryan wanted to call on the father of his prospective wife and seek the hand of his daughter in marriage he knew the father's strong religious feeling and thought he would strengthen his case by a quotation from the Bible; so he quoted the proverb of Solomon:

"Whoso findeth a wife findeth a good thing. But to his surprise the father replied with a citation from Paul to the effect that he that marrieth doeth well, but he that marrieth ^{not} doeth better. The young suitor was for a moment confounded.

Then with a happy inspiration he replied that Paul had no wife, and Solomon had 700, and Solomon, therefore, ought to be the better judge as to marriage!

2. Not an unequal marriage

B. Mark Twain and Olivia Langdon's marriage an illustration of how unbelief in a husband affects a believing wife.

"Livy, if it comforts you to lean on the Christian faith, do so." --

"I can't, Youth; I haven't any."

C. Clarence E. Macartney's 5 dents for marriage.

- (1) Don't marry a woman who does not pray.
- (2) Don't marry a bad-tempered or jealous woman.

- (3) Don't marry a woman who loves the moving pictures and the matinee more than the home.

- (4) Don't marry a woman who drinks. It is bad enough when a woman marries a man who drinks, infinitely worse when a man marries a woman who drinks.

- (5) Unless you have plenty of money, or she has plenty of money, so that you can employ someone to do it for you. Don't marry a woman who cannot cook or cannot learn to cook.

To the young woman:

- (1) Don't marry an unbeliever.
- (2) Don't marry a man of bad habits.

- (7) Trivial things
- (8) Leisure time.
- (9) Selfishness.
- (10) Religion, lack of faith.

2. How to avoid them.

B. Constant remembrance and keeping of wedding vows.

C. Christian faith and practice.

2. Based on love that cannot be degraded. Story of how they tried to ruin little Prince Louis, and he would clench his fists and shake his curly head and stamp his feet and cry, "I will not do it! I dare not do it! I was born to be a king, and I will not defile myself!"

3. Based on the grace of Christ alone:
'Twas not the church that saved my soul
nor yet my life so free from sin;
'Twas Jesus Christ, the Lamb of God,
He rescued me, He took me in.

'Twas not my works that saved my soul,
Nor yet my zeal, my prayers, my tears;
'Twas Jesus Christ, the Son of God,
