

Mother Charged In Road Tragedy

ALAMOGORDO, N.M. (UPI) — Child abuse charges were filed Friday against a mother of four who sat in a stranded van along a southern New Mexico highway without seeking aid while death and malnutrition stalked her family.

Otero County Sheriff Felix Work filed the charges against Mrs. Lillian Orr, 44, of Exeter Township, Pa., whose husband, William T. Orr, 48, and daughter, Annette, 13, died from carbon monoxide poisoning from a charcoal heater as

the family sat for days inside the vehicle after running out of gas.

Mrs. Orr and her three sons were in fair condition at an Alamogordo hospital suffering from malnutrition and carbon monoxide poisoning.

The family was penniless and out of food, but Work said the woman was charged because "food was available. There was help at a house within a quarter of a mile. There was an orchard across the road and they sat there suffering from malnutrition."

State policeman James Coon said Mrs. Orr told him Wednesday she was "scared to death to go for help because of what people might think."

Coon said apparently passers-by had tried to help, but the family's religious convictions prevented them from begging. She said she would not allow one of her sons to fish in a nearby mountain stream because he didn't have a license.

When the time comes budget submission to Pacific Air Forces (PACAF), the work is out to middle managers of various units labeled "Responsibility Centers." These centers submit all the necessary data and submit it to the Budget Office.

When the office receives information, they consolidate into one base-wide budget, encompassing all PACAF units on Clark. This comprehensive budget is then resubmitted to the middle managers of the Responsibility Centers who form a committee called the Financial Working Group.

This group goes over the complete budget making additions and subtractions to the various figures where needed. Once they have finished with the proposed budget, it is resubmitted to the Budget Office where it is polished and finalized for presentation.
