MK.11:21.

- A. INDICATES LACK OF FAITH.
- B. PETER'S GROWTH AND DEVELOPMENT HAS DEFINITELY BEEN ARRESTED.

VI. OVER-CONFIDENCE IN HIS OWN ABILITY TO REMAIN TRUE TO CHRIST, 14:29

- A. MANIFESTATION OF SELF-CENTERED CONFIDENCE.
- 1. HE IS BOASTFUL IN THE PLACE OF PERIL
- 2. THIS SEEMS LIKE GRAND-STAND HEROICS.
- B. HE PUTS HIMSELF IN CONTRAST WITH HIS BRETHREN.
- C. IT REFLECTS ON THE CORRECT ESTIMATE OF THE LORD.
HE THINKS HE KNOWS BETTER THAN THE LORD.

VII. FAILURE IN THE DEVOTIONAL LIFE, MK. 14:37.

- A. ASLEEP WHEN CHRIST ASKED HIM TO STAY AWAKE AND PRAY WITH HIM
IN THE GARDEN OF GETHSEMANE.
- B. BACKSLIDING WILL ALWAYS BE ACCCOMPANIED WITH FAILURE IN THE
DEVOTIONAL LIFE OF PRAYER AND BIBLE STUDY.

VIII. AN ATTEMPT TO MAKE UP IN ZEAL AND OUTWARD SERVICE, FOR WHAT
IS LACKING IN PRIVATE AND PERSONAL DEVOTION, V.47.

- A. ZEAL WITHOUT KNOWLEDGE.
- B. HE HAD NO RIGHT TO TAKE OUT THE SWORD WITHOUT HIS LORD'S COMMAND.
- C. HE WAS NERVOUS, JUMPY, UNEASY, CONVICTED, AND FEVERISH,
BECAUSE HE HAD LOST THE QUIET CALM AND PEACE OF AN
OBEYENT AND TRUSTFUL SOUL.
- D. THE MOMENT YOU FEEL IT NECESSARY TO PROVE YOUR LOYALTY,
THERE IS SOMETHING WRONG SOMEWHERE.

IX. HE WAS ANNOYED, OFFENDED, AND ANGRY AT THE REBUKE JESUS GAVE HIM FOR THIS RASH ACT. MT. 26: 51-54

- A. HE FELT HIS COURAGEOUS SERVICE WAS UNAPPRECIATED
- B. MANY BACKSLIDDED CHRISTIANS ARE EASILY OFFENDED

X. HE RESIGNS, STEPS OUT OF THE PICTURE, AND FOLLOWS JESUS ONLY AFAR OFF, V. 54

- A. HOW TYPICAL OF CHURCH MEMBERS WHO OFFER HURRIED RESIGNATIONS.
- B. JOHN, WHO HAD GONE ON INTO THE AUDIENCE CHAMBER, AND REMAINED CLOSEST TO THE LORD, WAS NOT MOLESTED AND DID NOT FAIL
- C. IN THE PLACE OF COMPROMISE —
NEITHER IN THE TRIAL CHAMBER NOR IN THE STREET OR CITY OUTSIDE.

XI. HE WARMs HIMSELF AT THE ENEMIES FIRE, V. 54.

- A. HE HAD SEVERED ALL CONNECTIONS WITH THE PEOPLE OF GOD.
- B. ATTEMPTING TO GET COMFORT AND SOME EMOTIONAL WARMTH WHERE THE WORLD IS GETTING IT.

XIII. FINALLY, OPEN AND BLASPHEMOUS DENIAL OF CHRIST, MK. 14:66-71.
