

Places to see in Eng - (Literature)

1. London - St. Paul's Cathedral -

Effigy of Jr. Donne (1573-1631)

Lincoln's Inn - Jn. D. was 1st chaplain to Anne of
St. Giles, med. chain Cripplegate, where Jn. Milton is buried.

2. Cambridge - Christ's College, where Jn. Milton studied.

3. London - House in Gough Square, an alley N. of Fleet
St., where Sam. Johnson lived (1749-59)

4. Bath - Little has changed.

- 4 Sydney Place, home of Jane Austen

- 11 Royal Crescent - the playwright Sheridan went
off with the singer Elizabeth Linley.

5. London - 48 Doughty St, near the Grey's Inn Road
(1837), where Chas. Dickens & his young son
lived. Now owned by the Dickens Fellowship
& open to public.

6. Edinburgh - museum - Lady Stair's House, in an alley
off the High Street
- contains relics of Walter Scott (1771-¹⁸³²)
& Robt. Louis Stevenson, & Robt. Burns
- 8 Howard Place - where Robt. L. Stevenson was born
(on northern fringes of Edin.)
- 17 Heriot Row, where Robt. L. Stevenson grew up.
(just across fr. Queen St. Gardens from 37 Castle St)

7. London area - just N. of Lon., Shaw's House at Ayot St. Lawrence
(1906-1950)

no. 24 Chayrs Row, where Thomas Carlyle
lived 1834-1881

8. Cockermouth, Cumbria - Wordsworth's birthplace

9. Rye, East Sussex, Lamb's House,
where Henry James spent the summers 1898-1916,
+ wrote The Ambassadors + The Golden Bowl.
